Little Giant in Austin Manitoba:

In the last week of July we took the Little Giant and engine to Austin, Manitoba and took part in the Harvesting Hope

(www.harvestinghope.ca) threshing bee. The Austin Museum is a large active agriculture museum. The purpose of their program this year was to bring attention to the World Food Grain Bank and world hunger. All donations and receipts were shared with this organization. The Guinness world book of records was also present to determine if the number of threshing outfits all operating at one time would set a new record. The result was that 8000-9000 people watch as 148 threshing machines started the 15 minute operating requirement. lf any outfit developed a problem they had 1 minute to correct the problem or they would be disqualified. At the end of the required time 139 outfits qualified and therefore set a new world record. The "Little Giant" performed flawlessly and the engine chugged along and provided the extra power when required. The "Little Giant" was a highlight which held the honor of being the oldest machine present. We have to wonder how many thousands of pictures were taken of the Little Giant and engine.
